- ☆ Our membership had a significant drop from 149 to 91. 50% are members of NATOA.
- ☆ Our treasury remained moderately healthy through limited activity. Chapter dues are \$50 for members of NATOA, and \$100 for non-NATOA members (\$30 will be remitted to NATOA).
- ☆ SCAN will provide remittance to **NATOA for Chapter Fee** for fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, as we resumed collection of dues. Although membership is down significantly, however, SCAN has remitted over \$26,000 over the last 8 years.
- ☆ Our **Twenty-Fifth Annual SCAN STAR Awards** video competition has been delayed until the fall with **259 entries from 17 separate jurisdiction**. There were 43 competitive categories. The ceremony will premiere exclusively on the **SCANNATOA YouTube Channel**.
- ☆ SCAN has continued **Social Media** services to distribute information to members through **Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, and LinkedIn**; a member List serve is used for **announcements and discussions of relevant issues**.
- ☆ Your **SCAN List serve connects 86** municipal and professional representatives.
- ☆ **Supporting Green Efforts** by posting Meeting Notices and Annual Report on Listserve and website; and electronic voting whereby decreasing printing, postage, and labor costs and reducing paper waste.

The last two fiscal years of the global pandemic, changes in technology, rapid cord cutting impact on franchise fees, advancement of streaming services, employee great resignations, DIVCA (California), and fiscal impacts on local governments has had a lasting impact on SCAN NATOA. The Board of Directors continue to adapt to our new normal and our membership is making strides in delivering content and support to our local governments and communities. SCAN stands in support of our membership to provide intelligent leadership, through technology, programming, and regulatory recommendations. SCAN is committed to adapting and transforming our chapter in order to provide relevant content, programs and advice to its members.
